The WG will provide:

- its assessment of the current state of play and of the factors for success or failure of the ERA policy framework so far;
- draw lessons from the experience since 2000;
- outline possible options for a new narrative/paradigm on the future of the ERA.

Future actions

After options for the new paradigm are agreed, the WG shall prepare (for the ERAC December meeting) its Deliverable B:

A narrative for the new paradigm

A set of priorities

Assessment of the current state of play

Over the last two decades, a wide range of ERA related policy reforms and initiatives have been successfully implemented, contributing towards the overarching objective to realise the ERA.

Consensus:

ERA did not achieve ALL its objectives but ERA ACHIEVED MANY MAJOR FUNDAMENTAL SUCCESSES.

CONCLUSIONS

- Progress on ERA implementation has been slowing down since 2015
- There are still major disparities between countries and regions, some of which are even diverging rather than converging
- There is an unhealthy level of concentration of R&I excellence pockets across Europe.
- Many national R&I policies miss an European dimension, hindering joint multi-level action that is essential for a fully functioning ERA

20 RECOMMENDATIONS ... (in reality, 19+1)

OVERALL OBJECTIVES:

Strengthen R&I contribution to achieve Europe's wider policy goals.

Make ERA more responsive to society.

Promote the adoption of ambitious knowledge policies, targeting researchers, innovators, R&I organisations and citizens

Broaden the outreach of ERA related initiatives.

RECOMMENDATIONS IN A NUTSHELL

A convincing/modern new narrative focusing on some policy objectives

AND

a focus on implementation that will **improve relevance**, **impacts and visibility of ERA policies** at EU and national/regional level.

Lighthouses

Objectives:

- To achieve a faster and more tangible ERA implementation.
- To focus on common interests and seize opportunities of joint action.
- To achieve effective cooperation/coordination with sectoral policies.

What are they?:

- Not a funding instrument!
- Not "missions" nor "improved JTIs".
- They will connect existing measures and actions into a coherent multilevel framework, focused on delivery and impact.
- They will be tailor-made to their intended objectives/goals.

Lighthouses

- The design should be driven first by R&I policy makers
- Then bring in sectoral policy and broader societal actors
- Co-implementation by R&I and sectoral policy

Two possible types of lighthouses:

- Structural "ERA" issues
- Thematic "challenges" issues

Two examples in paper to illustrate the concept (they are not proposed topics for lighthouses):

- Knowledge for sustainable growth: Science-industry links (structural)
- Knowledge against Forest Fires (thematic)
